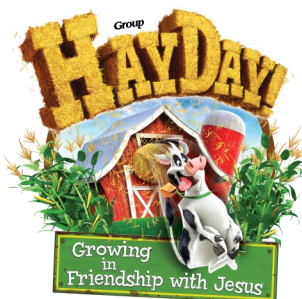

Notes from Doug Whittemore

A new year is upon us and well under steam as we look for ways anew to serve our God who blesses. Late last year my father started to decline with multiple medical problems, and I had the opportunity to help him, advocating for him to fellow physicians, and spending more time with him before he passed away in December. I thank the Lord that He worked out circumstances in such a way that they optimally enabled me to do this and be with him near the end. He had always supported my mission work and to his memory this year's missions are dedicated.

Honduras

On March 17 I travel again to Siguatepeque to work at Hospital Evangelico for two weeks. I will be staying again with my old friend Dr. Nahim Nasralla who has been a faithful and tireless surgeon who albeit well into his 80's remains active scrubbing in to assist on cases and otherwise helping the hospital in countless ways. One of these ways includes putting me up in his comfortable home on the hospital campus, not to mention driving me to and from the airport in San Pedro Sula two hours away. I am only one of a number of visiting doctors he hosts during the course of a year. Spending time with him and enjoying his Christian fellowship is one of the great joys of this mission trip every year. And his hospitality is wonderful for which I will always be grateful to him. The hospital there expects the arrival of a full time Urologist in December, so I am not sure whether this year may be my last in travelling to this lovely mission hospital which faithfully has served the Lord for so many years.

Dr Nasralla had also advised me that one of the hospital's endoscopic instruments which I frequently use is in disrepair. I spent several weeks researching options and chose to purchase my own, as it should be helpful at a number of other mission sites, particularly in Africa. My prayers are that this will be a wise investment.

Otherwise, I seek your prayer support for safe travels, that patients come with hearts open to God's message of love through his Son, and that always God is glorified through the work done there.

Mexico

Once again, our team of Urologists, anesthesia providers, nurses, translators, pastoral counselors, logistics providers, and sometimes students and surgeons in training leave on April 27 for our semi-annual mission to Valladolid in the Yucatan.

In past reports, you may remember that we have been upgrading our technology to allow us to treat the many kidney stone patients we see with "percutaneous" surgery and avoid the open surgery that is more risk to the kidney, more recovery for the patient, and more loss of work which these poor people can ill afford. God has been with us through this transition and has blessed our efforts such that on the last mission we were able to do all our cases percutaneously. Our one weak point was a single instrument that allowed us to reduce the size of large stones so that we could remove them through the tube placed in the kidney through the small one inch incision. Well, this instrument cracked early on in the mission and could have failed entirely on a number of cases leaving us stranded in the middle of surgery. But God kept it going, and miraculously brought it back to life several times, so that we made it through the whole week. We never lost sight of Whom we depended on for success and to Whom we give all the glory. Who can doubt that prayers make a difference? Not me.

Our patients there at San Lucas medical center touch all of our hearts with their grateful demeanor and their openness to the gospel. Some consider themselves believers in Jesus Christ and others not, but there is a spiritual awakening happening here which is early and real and requires a grass roots church that will serve their needs. We fervently pray for God to bring this to fruition and the right leadership to present itself.

Our team also asks for your prayers. In particular, our team needs anesthesia providers and translators, as well as the necessary equipment to continue to do percutaneous surgery. May God provide me and my co-leader Paul Church with hearts and wisdom to continue to assist this wonderful team that serves a wonderful God.
